# What is Extended Producer Responsibility for packaging?

- The aim of EPR is to make producers fully responsible for the full net cost of managing the packaging they place on the UK market
- Incentivise a move to more sustainable packaging
  - Make packaging recycled and created from recycled materials
  - Fund the cost of collection and recycling
- Cost expected to be approx. £1.4 billion a year
- Consulted on in 2021 – approx. 200 pages of questions in the consultation document – not straightforward

# What are the new rules?

Under the new regulations you may need to:

- collect and submit data on the packaging you handle and supply
- pay a waste management fee
- buy packaging waste recycling notes (PRNs) or packaging waste export recycling notes (PERNs) to meet your recycling obligations
- submit information about where your packaging has been sold, hired, loaned, gifted or discarded – this is called ‘nation data’.
- What you need to do depends on whether you’re classed as a ‘small’ or ‘large’ organisation.

# Are you impacted?

You may be impacted if you:

- supply packaged goods to the UK market under your own brand
  - package goods for another UK organisation
  - use 'transit packaging' to protect goods during transport so they can be sold to UK consumers
  - import products in packaging
  - own an online marketplace
  - hire or loan out reusable packaging
  - sell empty packaging.

# What data to collect?

There should be 4 parts to the data you collect about your packaging. These are:

- packaging activity – this is how you put the packaging on the market
- packaging material and weight
- packaging type – primary, secondary, shipment or transit
- waste type

Your data submission must include the weight of:

- Individual materials in the packaging you handle and supply
- materials used in your ‘primary’, ‘secondary’, ‘shipment’ and ‘transit’ packaging
- packaging likely to become household or non-household waste
- packaging likely to end up in street bins.

# Timeframes

- 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023 – start collecting data
- 1<sup>st</sup> July – 1<sup>st</sup> October 2023 – submit data (for LARGE businesses)
- 1<sup>st</sup> Jan – 1<sup>st</sup> April 2024 – submit data (for SMALL businesses)
  
- First year – set fees from the government
- Second year – modulated fees – depending on type of material (lower if it's easier to recycle)



# Summary

- EPR comes into force 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023
- May impact those who supply packed goods to UK market, or package for another organisation
- May have to collect and submit data on the packaging supply
- Waste management fee (currently unknown)
- Buy PRNs or PERNs (if you're a large business)
- Depends whether you're a small or large organisation + other factors
- Potentially record nation data
